February 24, 1927

Howard H. Miller, Ralston Pioneer, died on Friday from pneumonia. Came to Colo. in 1877 (born Cadiz, Ohio May 24, 1855) married Miss Rocella Tucker - survived by 5 children - Alfred C. Miller, Denver - George T. Miller, L.<sup>o</sup>A. - Hulda Smith of Golden - Margaret Brayfield of Denver and Howard H., Jr. of Golden.

Moffat Tunnel holed through "last Friday". Louis Larsen of N. Graves piloted the crack special train furnished for the celebration by the Moffat railroad. John Trezise of Denver, formerly of Arvada, was the Fireman.

March 3, 1927

March 10, 1927

Beet growers were reminded to meet the beet train for a special demonstration on how to increase yields. Beet labor was to receive \$24 per acres - \$10 for blocking and thinning, \$2 for hoeing, \$1 for weeding, \$11 for topping with bonus of 50¢ per acre for each ton over 12 tons per acre.

Heavy snows covered Colorado.

March 31, 1927

J. C. Blott opened an office in the Smith Block to sell an electro magnetic Health belt, said to be great for curing various diseases.

(Mrs. J. T. Kennedy was an aunt of Thompson Secrest).

April 7, 1927

Monson-Roberts Co. of Ralston - manufacturers of the Moro plow for Fordson Tractors - plan to move to Arvada soon. The Moro Plow is the most successful plow on the market for attachment to the Fordson Tractor.

Whenever there's a luncheon or dinner it reads "Covers will be laid for -- and the guests."

(Leota Manaugh 8 on Sat. April 2, 1927) must be a different Leota as it lists Mrs. Ray Monaugh and daughter Leota, also.

April 14, 1927

New Trustees sworn in - E. L. Kelso, F. C. Vetting, & George West. Sworn in by Justice of the Peace, George C. Townsley. Mayor Miller remained as Mayor. Kind of a rattle over license of Peterson's pool-room. License granted with understanding that the whole room, not just the pool tables, close at 11:00.

E. L. Newcomb, parents of Mrs. John J. Bennet & Etta Winger.

John F. White, Founder of Enterprise, died of cancer. Had lived in Arvada 36 years. Pastor of M. E. Church, organized First State Bank of Arvada (absorbed by First National in 1925). John Furneaux White born at Penryn Cornwall England. Had been a machinest at Silver Plume. Four children survive - Leslie White of Seattle, Mrs. Charles Allen of Arvada, Morley P. White of Denver, Arthur E. White and 2 grandchildren, Elbert & Willard Allen.

Mrs. E. E. Benjamin relatives - H. A. Wales, J. T. Wales & E. R. Wales.

April 21, 1927

Town purchased 400 ft. of standard fire hose, and 6 fire coats. Gives the department 1500 ft. of hose to divide between the truck and the reel, which is held for emergencies.

Arvada Womens' Club donated eggs to Sands house & Craig Colony for Easter Sunday - 73 dozens in all.

Work started on paving the intersection of Wadsworth & Ralston.

April 28, 1927

Grade school Operetta "A Sunny Spring Morning" put on to buy a piano, under direction of R. Jefferson Hall. Mrs. H. H. Juchem CPT president for second year.

Ralston Pioneer, Mary H. Carroll, died in Wheatland, Wyoming. Family (Price) lived in 3rd log cabin within present site of Denver, May 1859. Shortly thereafter they moved to Ralston Creek, where she spent her youth. Just before start of Civil War she married William Carroll and had 10 children. She lived over 40 yrs. in RAlston Creek and left there 16 years ago to live near her children in Wheatland.

May 5, 1927

C. R. Buck reelected treasure of Arvada School Board.

Discussion at Chamber of Commerce on Harvest Festival and whether it should be Arvada & Jefferson County Harvest Festival. No decision made. East RAlston Rd. being curbed from Wadsworth to Tramway cut.

Ralston School is sponsoring a Community Day Program on Sat. May 14th.

Marguerite Gotchell teaching music, playing violin solos on KOA.

Third street residents were putting in sidewalks between RAlston Rd. & Grant Pl. on the west side of the road.

Elbert Allen married Elizabeth Rice of Dgenver.

May 12, 1927

Arvada Post Office raised to Second Class Rating - receipts were over \$8,000 last year. Mr. R. L. Newton, Postmaster; D. T. Embry, Clerk and Jimmy Tracy, part-time Clerk. (D. T. Embry came from Winona, Miss.)

"Hootch" Raid made on the old Kimmett farm, 1 mile north of Fremont Grange Hall and  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile south of Arapahoe station on the Leyden car line - one of the largest booze-making factories in history of Jeffco

Walt Heaslet reappointed day Marshall at \$150 per month.

May 19, 1927

Irene Murchison, daughter of Senator Murchison, was appointed to State Board of Nurse Examiners, by Gov. Billy Adams.

May 26, 1927

Fire destroyed Ray Cannon dairyhouse. Started by 5 year old Richard, who was playing with a blazing stick. A gasoline can ignited and exploded. Wind hindered them but firemen saved the big barn.

June 2, 1927

Heavy rain and hail on Tuesday - terrific lightning and 2 separate hail storms.

New mail service - due to taking off C & S passenger service and the new 2nd class rating of the P.O. There will be automobile delivery twice daily and once on Sunday.

Business houses began using Arvada Harvest Festival envelopes to advertize the Festival. They carried a panoramic picture of last years festival.

E. E. Reno suing Robert Swadley for a 1/6 interest in the Swadley Ditch.

June 2, 1927 (Contd)

C & S, passenger trains discontinued between Denver & Silver Plume. Freight trains will continue.

June 9, 1927

Evans & Bennett awarded contract to haul the mail.

A. L. Davis starts excavation for building at corner of Wadsworth & Church - an addition to his present building on Wadsworth.

Mr. Raybourn was Supt. of Schools.

June 16, 1927

Thompson Brothers, Inc., agents for Hudson & Essex autos, leased the Arvada Warehouse on Railroad Ave. Use it as a repair shop and service station. Fred Thompson, senior member of the firm, will be in charge of the service department.

Town Board split over night marshall.

June 23, 1927

Dawson & Dawson purchased by W. J. Campbell of Ault.

O. H. Guether & Fred Stech bought Arvada Cleaners from H. J. Jones.

D. T. Embry arrived from Winona, Miss.

June 30, 1927

Arvada Town Baseball Team won.

Night Marshall question settled by out both application and advertising for a man to fill the position.

July 7, 1927

Fire caused by firecrackers destroyed the icehouse at Cottonwood farm.

"Arvada Mail Truck under Suspicion as Big Booze Runner" Denver cops saw it pass Berkely Park each morning and decided it was a booze runner. Lay in wait for it - found nothing but mail sacks.

(J. A. Newcombe parents of Mrs. R. C. Raud.)

July 14, 1927

Richard Boehm came to Arvada in 1900 and worked with Louis Klunker in his Tannery here, later establishing a small Tannery of his own on Wadsworth Avenue. Died from injuries suffered in a fall at the home of his son, George Boehm at 1941 Acoma, Denver.

W. W. Benson new Night Cop. Started work immediately.

Homegrown raspberries were selling at \$2.50 per crate of 24 pints, beets were 25¢ per dozen bunches, while peas and cauliflower were 6¢ a pound. Cabbage was 75¢ per 100 lbs. and celery was 50¢ a dozen. Cherries were \$1.75 per crate of 24 pints.

Harvest Festival name was enlarged to The Arvada & Jefferson County Harvest Festival, as it was a county affair.

J. M. Price purchased the Fire Insurance Business, handled by the First National Bank.



July 25, 1927

Arvada Motors went out of business.

Many accidents with autos due to fast driving youths. 2 killed at Wadsworth & Lincoln Ave. near N. Keller St. on Keller Hill, 2 boys going too fast on 48th - 50 MPR, S. of Arvada - 3 others accidents.

Miss Erna Fischer of 337 W. Grandview Ave. was serving as reporter for the P.U.C.

Alex Seath - barber.

"All of the grocery stores in Arvada are closed this afternoon in order that the owners, clerks & bookkeepers can attend the Retail Grocers' picnic which is being held this afternoon at Elitch's Gardens in Denver.

Editorial - "Several residents of Arvada who attended the fire Tuesday, are impressed with the big America LaFrance Pumper truck used by Denver Company #17. Arvada is to get one like it. It can pump a heavy stream of water into 2 ordinary hoses out of the irrigation ditch."

John Hooper, 6 year old son of the Gordon Hoopers has been quite ill with Influenza which has developed into typhoid fever.

"Bill Benson, new night marshall has appointed a new deputy in the person of a big German police dog which he is taking the rounds and learning the business."

Harold, Howey & Fred Thompson busy combining wheat on fathers ranch on Federal Blvd.

July 28, 1927

Heavy rains flooded Arvada, wheat was beaten down and truck farms soaked too much. Good news for the beet farmers, however.

Big Still found on E. E. Kohn farm, 6 miles N.W. of Arvada. Cleverly concealed: "bales of straw had been placed together in a pyramid 20 ft. high, 30 ft. wide & 90 ft. long. The Center of the pyramid had been left a hollow room, where the still and other paraphernalia was located. Entrance to the room was by removing one of the top bales of the pyramid and climbing down a ladder.

Ralston Road being graveled to connect with Coal Creek Canyon Rd. at 4th St. It is the poorest stretch of road between Denver and the Moffat tunnel.

Mary Lynn Inn opened for business in the Davis Block. Run by Mr. & Mrs. R. B. Moseley.

August 4, 1927 (Contd)

Dr. E. L. Foster, Arvada Health Officer, put out an edict ordering the hauling of all water because of a typhoid fever outbreak. Four cases in the city: John H. Wilson, Frances Lilley, Doris Bullock & John Hooper. (It was not true typhoid but paratyphoid)

The Economy Store was advertizing their 23rd & probably last Annual Summer Sale - on account of Mrs. Recht's health.

October 27, 1927 (Contd)

Water system completed - all wells (3) now pumped into reservoir and lifted by centrifugal to overhead tower after sterilization.

"Coal Strike hits Arvada". Leyden went out 100% - no coal on hand in Arvada except a little Route County semi-anthracite and on it the price has really jumped. Evans & Bennett ordered some from Wyoming, but the railroads commandeered it. They also had several trucks bringing in Route County "Stoking" coal. C. R. Buck had enough to run him until noon. Fred Tiller was clear out. He thinks the "strike is a frame-up between mine owners and officers of the mine unions & IWW in an attempt to shoot price of coal sky high". Miners want 5-day week, 6 hrs. per day with a wage of \$8 to 8.50 per day. Owners say this would bankrupt them. Mine conditions do need improvement. Only maintenance men are working at Leyden.
