The narrow gauge freight and passenger trains want through Arvada on their way to Idaho Springs, Central City, Georgetown and Silver Plume. Passenger service was discontinued in 1927, and narrow gauge freight soon after that. The standard gauge line stopped at its present terminal in Golden.
