MUSEUM - By Margaret Alexander

August and September will be banner months for historical buffs in Arvada. The Gallery of the Arvada Center will be filled with over 300 prints of the West in the 19th century. The collection of Graham Curtis of Lakewood will be shown in an exhibition titled "The Saga of the American West in Prints." Many of the prints were made by artists who accompanied the two dozen government expeditions which explored, mapped, and reported on the West for the U.S. Army. Famous artists like Karl Bodmer, John James Audubon, Carl Wimar, George Catlin, and Thomas Moran are represented in the collection.

The exhibition opens on August 16 with a gala reception from 6 to 9 p.m. Arvada Historical Society members are invited to attend and enjoy a special performance by the Central City Opera Company of the "Face on the Barroom Floor", performed in the well of the Arvada Center's Museum.

The Museum is gearing up for a new exhibition, "Victorian Domestic Design", which opens August 29. Objects and decorative arts from the last half of the 19th century will illustrate the wide range of styles and materials Victorians employed in household design. Objects from the collection of Arvada Historical Society will be supplemented by pieces from the Colorado Historical Society, the Pioneers Museum in Colorado Springs, the Boulder Historical Society, and many private collections.

Along with Victoriana, our visitors to the Museum can see photogravures by Edward Curtis, the premier photographer of the American Indian in the early 20th century.

The docents of the Museum will receive acting lessons in July and August to train them for "The Ghost of the Haines Log House", a play written by Steve Hotchner especially for the Museum. The play calls for two adult actors and up to 30 children who "act out" life on the Colorado frontier with Abbie Haines. Details about booking the play for children's groups are described in a new brochure about the Museum which will be available at the end of August.



WE NEED YOUR HELP!! - From the Lakewood Historical Society

The Ralston Crossing School, the only school of the old Jeffco District #12 has been located at Belmar Museum at 797 South Wadsworth Blvd., since September of 1983.

Prior to 1869, two institutions grew on the homestead of Fracis J. McQuiston at 6730 Indiana St. The first of these institutions was the Ralston Creek Methodist-Episcopal Church credited to the year 1867. The second institution is the Ralston Crossing School which inherited the church by 1869.



The School continued as a one-room building until 1918 when a second class-room was added. The school remained at 6730 Indiana Street until 1918 when a second classroom was added. The School remained at 6730 Indiana Street until September, 1956, when it was moved to Vivian Elementary School, at 10500 W. 25th Avenue. A second career then began as one of R-1's famous temporary buildings.

In September of 1983, a third career began. The School was offered to and accepted by the Lakewood Historical Society to be displayed at Belmar Park.

The celebration for the August closing of East Arvada Junior High School (formerly Arvada High School, 1920-1954 and Arvada Junior High School, 1954-1971) at 7225 Ralston Road was held on July 28 from 1 to 4 p.m. The afternoon was a complete success with some 500 former students, teachers, and superintendents returning to the building for the last time before the building is sold.

The affair was sponsored by Dr. John Peper, Superintendent of Jefferson County Schools; Mr. Bob Ferris, Jefferson County North Area Superintendent; and Deane Darnell, Principal of East Arvada Junior High who was the Celebration Chairman.

The Arvada Historical Society was asked to put on an exhibit for the years the building was used as a high school. IN MEMORIAM

WALLACE A LINDSTROM

Wallace A. Lindstrom was born May 26, 1910, in Leonardville, Kansas. His father was born in Sweden and married Edna Medora Hanson. They raised their twelve children on a farm in this Swedish community. Wallace attended Leonardville High School and played on the football team. He attended the Kansas City College of Commerce for two years before volunteering for the Army Air Transport Command in 1942. He flew as radio operator for the ATC for four years during World War II.

June 22, 1947 he married Lois Cunniff of Trinidad, Colorado, and they lived in Pueblo, Colorado, where Wallace was a salesman with Mutual of New York Insurance. In January, 1955, he became the first Field Representative for the Colorado Education Association, Division of Insurance, and traveled the entire state of Colorado. The Lindstroms moved to Arvada in January, 1960, and in September of that year, their daughter, Linnea Eileen, was born.

Wallace retired in 1970 and built a new family home. He continued church and youth activities at the Arvada Presbyterian Church, but increasingly devoted his time to the Arvada Historical Society. He was part of the original Board, serving as a Director 1972-81, and was President of the organization 1977-78. He planned the first Tri-High Song Festival, the first dedication of the Lewis Ralston Gold Site, organized the dinosaur dig, and the lowering and wood preservation of an historic barn. He was a member of the Arvada Cultural Center Committee 1973 which insured the birth of the Arvada Center for the Arts and Humanities. He secured donations of items for the Museum at the Center and arranged for their restoration.

In 1978, Wallace became the volunteer contractor and builder for the Arvada Flour Mill Restoration, serving as Manager and Tour Director of the restored Mill 1980-83. In 1981 he received an Image Award from the Arvada Chamber of Commerce.

Through his life Wallace worked with young people as Sunday school teacher, Fellowship Coordinator, and also coached Little League football. He participated in many community drives, both in Pueblo and Arvada.

Memorial services for Wallace A. Lindstrom were held Monday, July 30, 1984, 10:00 a.m. Arvada Presbyterian Church, 5592 Independence, Arvada, Colorado. He is survived by wife, Lois; daughter, Linnea; brother, Barrett Lindstrom of Thompson, Ohio; sister, Janice Lewis of Clay Center, Kansas; and many nieces and nephews.

The Historical Society will long remember his many hours of hard work. His life was active and filled with dedicated service and is an inspiration to all of us. We will miss him.

FRANK CYNN WIDEMAN

Frank Lynn Wideman, son of John and Ella Donaho Wideman, was born in Idaho Springs, September 13, 1901. After his father's death, the family moved to Arvada in 1906 because it was recently incorporated as a "dry" town. Young Wideman attended the Arvada Public Schools for 12 years and graduated with the class of 1919.

During his early years, he was employed by area farmers, by the Denver Shale Brick Company, and in the summer of 1921, he worked on the construction of the first paved road from Berkeley to Arvada.

Following his graduation from the Colorado School of Mines in 1923, he was employed at the Apex Mine in Bingham Canyon, Utah, where he met and married Agnes James.

As a Mining Engineer, he was employed by several mining companies and by the U.S. Bureau of Mines and was sent on assignments to Utah, Arizona, Afghanistan, Washington D.C., and Denver.

After his retirement, he spent his later years in Arvada where he remained active in the Arvada United Presbyterian Church, Park County and the Arvada Historical Societies.

Frank L. Wideman died May 8, 1984, and survivors include his wife, Agnes; two daughters, Helen Cooke and Betty Beech of Arvada; one son, Charles of Whitehall, Montana, seven grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.

DR. DIDA D. MAHORNEY

Dr. Viva D. Mahorney, born November 5, 1889, in Smith Center, Kansas, died May 16, 1984. She married Albert B. Mahorney, November 25, 1906. Both were among the 3,000 students of the class of 1923, who graduated from the Palmer Chiropractic College in Davenport, Iowa.

Dr. Viva Mahorney opened her Arvada chiropractor's office in 1925 and continued in this profession for the next 50 years.

Survivors include a sister, Amy Exline of Arvada and a brother, E. G. Reese of Harrisburg, Oregon. Her husband predeceased her in July of 1957.

AL TOMSIC

Al L. Tomsic was born June 23, 1920 in Primero, Colorado and died at Saint Joseph Hospital in Denver in May, 1984. He lived in Fort Morgan, Colorado where he had served as a lieutenant in charge of the Northeast District of the Colorado State Patrol. He attended Arvada schools and was a graduate of Arvada High School.

During World War II, Al served in the U.S. Navy. He was a member of the Arvada Police Department from 1947 to 1952 and was with the State Patrol from 1952 to 1975. He was a member of the Rocky Mountain Consistory Lodge 67 and of the Elks Club.

He is survived by his wife, the former Marion Rease, whom he married in Arvada; a son, Robert of Fort Morgan; a daughter, Mary, of Loveland; his mother, Lona Tomsic of Arvada; a sister, Mary Sekulich, also of Arvada; and two granddaughters.

Services were held on Tuesday, May 22, at the United Presbyterian Church in Fort Morgan with burial in that city's Memory Garden Cemetery.


COUIS GRADES

A native Arvadan, Louis Graves was born on July 23, 1904, and died May 30, 1984 in Lutheran Medical Center, Wheat Ridge. He was a graduate of Arvada High School and had worked for the Jefferson County Road Management Department and for Stonehouse Sign Company in Arvada.

On September 2, 1930, Louis married an Arvada teacher, Mildred Meredith, in her hometown of Rye, Colorado.

Louis was always interested in Arvada and was a very active citizen. He was a member of the Arvada Volunteer Fire Department, Arvada Masonic Lodge 141, Royal Arch Lodge of Golden, El Jebel Shrine in Denver, and Friendship Chapter 137 of the Order of Eastern Star. He was a charter member of the Arvada Historical Society and was presented with a Life membership in recognition of his many outstanding servies to the Society. He was a past grand guardian of Jobs Daughters, a member of the Arvada Lions Club, and belonged to the Arvada United Methodist Church.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two daughters, Juanita Harvey of Golden and Agnes Haug of Arvada. He is also survived by two sisters, Mildred Woolsey of Tucson, Arizona and Beth Stone of Granby, Colorado; a brother, Walter, of Pierre, South Dakota, five grandchildren and two greatgrandchildren. Burial was in the Arvada Cemetery.
